



Replanting Olive Trees for Peace in Palestine

Israeli forces and settlers have destroyed over one million olive trees belonging to Palestinians. Why? To strike at their livelihoods, create economic hardships, and displace them from their land. Once trees are removed and farmers are forced to leave their land, Israelis may claim and add this land to their settlements in occupied Palestine. This is one of many aggravating factors leading to Palestinian resistance and the current war.

Help MennoPIN (Mennonite Palestine Israel Network) and the Mennonite Men JoinTrees campaign raise \$50,000 to replace 2,500-3,000 olive trees and enable Palestinian families to remain on their land.

Background

Trees of life are presented in the first and last chapters of the Bible and Ezekiel 34:25-31 as essential for God's peace. Through history, olive trees have been the most important trees in Palestine and are protected under Mosaic law (Deut. 20:19).

Today, olive trees are part of the identity of Palestinians and vital for their livelihood. Palestinian families have olive trees, some over 1,000 years old, that have passed from generation to generation. Critical in the economy of Palestine, nearly half of agricultural lands are olive orchards for essential products for local consumption and foreign export. Because olive trees are tough and resilient, they also represent Palestinian resistance.

Response

MennoPIN and Mennonite Men are raising funds to replace destroyed olive trees and planning to help Palestinians replant. These are acts of solidarity, support, and resistance.
